PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear Friend,

The Laurel Hill Association has played a vital role in Stockbridge since 1853 for one reason: because people like you care about keeping our town a special place for residents and visitors. Thanks to ongoing support, the Laurel Hill Association—the oldest existing village improvement organization in the nation—maintains trails and properties in town and keeps the gardens in front of the Post Office and around town monuments beautiful.

In the past year, friends like you contributed to much-needed improvements to the Mary Flynn trail, the trail to Laura's Tower, and Laurel Hill Park—three of our most iconic and popular properties. If you haven't done so, I encourage you to climb Laura's Tower and enjoy panoramic views.

We are continuing the restoration of Laurel Hill Park, our signature property. We can undertake this important work only because of the support we receive from friends like you, along with generous grants from the Lenox Garden Club and the Stockbridge Community Preservation Committee.

In addition, we continued our ongoing work to remove invasive plants from the Larrywaug Brook wetland and adjacent woodlands—a project that will be completed this year. This Stockbridge gateway is protected through a partnership with Stockbridge Land Trust, Berkshire Botanical Gardens, and the Town of Stockbridge.

And we're making Lower Bowker's Woods more accessible. This year we installed a parking area and improved the trails, and in the coming months we'll install new signage. If you haven't been to Lower Bowker's Woods, I encourage you to visit. It's a special place with unusual habitats, and it's one of the few secluded areas in town where you can get close to the Housatonic River.

These are a few of Laurel Hill Association's accomplishments in the past year. There's a lot more to do. For example, this year, thanks to a Stockbridge Community Preservation Committee grant, we will plan a new accessible trail system between Rt. 183 and Larrywaug Brook, on property just north of the Norman Rockwell Museum. This is an exciting venture, and you'll hear much more about it as we move ahead.

The Laurel Hill Association is unique. We're not simply a land conservation organization or a civic beautification club. We are cultural, historical, environmental, educational, recreational, and devoted to economic development and beautification. For 166 years, we've been a central part of the culture of Stockbridge, with programs that combine music, history, and the arts. We provide tours of our properties that touch on our history. We use our resources to hire local arborists, landscapers, habitat restoration specialists, and community partners like Greenagers. We protect Stockbridge's special lands, wetlands, and wildlife habitats, and control invasive species. We offer events for all ages, exploring the environment and history of Stockbridge. And we own and maintain some of the most iconic trails in the Berkshires for public benefit.

In sum, we carry out our mission to improve the quality of life and of the environment in Stockbridge by looking at the whole: the range of qualities and characteristics that make the town healthy and vibrant, and that build community. We could not do this work—or, for that matter, do basic maintenance on our properties—without hard-working volunteers, members and supporters. If you are among them, thank you from the bottom of my heart. Without you, Stockbridge would lose what makes it special. If you aren't yet among them, I hope you'll consider joining your Stockbridge friends and neighbors in supporting the Laurel Hill Association.

I love seeing you out on the trails and in town. And if I don't see you, I certainly want to hear from you. 
Thank you for all you do to keep Stockbridge the gem that we all love.

PROPERTIES AND TRAILS



New parking completed at Lower Bowker's Woods

LHA recently completed a new parking area at Lower Bowker's woods on Glendale Middle Road, between the Golf Club and Route 183.

Between the small gravel lot and the clearing along the road, we've made it easier for four to six cars to park there.

Lower Bowker's Woods contains a set of meandering trails that include an elevated path above the Housatonic River with views to a beautiful wetland and an upland portion that winds around the property.

It's an easy two minute drive from Main St. or the Norman Rockwell Museum to this LHA property. It's typically a quiet oasis in town, with relatively few visitors inside the park at any given time. It's a great place to reflect, to walk your dog, to enjoy great views of the river, to commune with the natural Berkshires at their best.



Envisioning a new Larrywaug trail with viewing platforms

How would you like to walk or ski from Church Street all the way to Route 183? The Laurel Hill Association intends to install wheelchair-accessible trails that create this connection, embarking on an ambitious plan to add a trail and viewing platforms to Byron Preserve and Four Corners.

We envision the The Phase 1 trail will start at Route 183 in the Byron Preserve and will run through the wooded upland that lies west of Larrywaug Brook. It will include branches to two viewing platforms. One will overlook the Larrywaug Brook wetland. The other will be located where Larrywaug Brook meets the Housatonic River, providing a wide view of the river and the Norman Rockwell Museum.

Phase 2 will go from the Larrywaug viewing platform, cross the wetland via a series of suspension bridges, run behind the Transfer Station, and end at Church Street at the Grange. This trail will meet community access needs from Pinewoods to the center of town.

The Stockbridge Community Preservation Committee has funded trail design for Phase 1.



LHA continues its extensive renovation of Laurel Hill Park

It's always been a gorgeoous piece of land, but Laurel Hill Park needed a bit of sprucing up as of late. Last year, we began to do just that.

If you came to Laurel Hill Day in 2018, you might have noticed the clearing of overgrowth on the rock face of the Rostrum, an open air meeting place designed by Daniel Chester French. This year, we've continued to judiciously trim and clear new growth to restore the views and maintain the trails.

We are also in the process of renovating the Butler Bench, a love seat atop Laurel Hill. The venerable marble seat is showing its age, with a few chips and cracks. We plan to have this repaired by the end of the year.

One thing we aren't doing right now is altering the ground. The Stockbridge Munsee Indians have asked us to hold off on any disturbance until after they have a change to perform an archaelogical survey. We plan to hold off on this aspect of the renovation until they complete whatever work they deem necessary.



Mary Flynn Trail: bridge, railing and boardwalk repairs complete

For those of us who need gentler exercise, the Mary Flynn Trail's relative flatness is a welcome feature! The trail follows at Housatonic River at the base of Laurel Hill, and is one of four LHA trail systems that can be accessed from the end of Park Street.

And also like many of us, the Mary Flynn Trail was showing its age, with portions of the bridges, boardwalks and rails all in need of repair.

Working with both volunteers and Greenagers summer employees, we recently completed this repairs, restoring the trail to its intended state and ensuring the safety of its users.




